WHEN/HOW SHOULD WE HONOR THE KING?

When the wise men realized that something was different in the announcement and birth of baby Jesus, they knew that something special had to be done. The same is true for the shepherds who had seen His star from afar and looked for Him. That means that how we see and seek Jesus should be different than any other seeing or seeking.

We claim relationship with Him. He is Savior. He is Lord. He is healer. He is deliverer. He is provider. Some have gone as far as to say He is everything to them.

While so many professing believers pay homage to the Lord Jesus at select times of the year, Christmas, Passover, and Easter to name a few, that same formula would not work if we only expected something from Him several times a year. Our dependence on Him is a daily dependence. Well, this is true for some professing believers.

The point that I am trying to drive home here is that we should want to worship Him often, daily; and some of that worship should be spontaneous. Whereas I believe that some of our worship should be planned and carved out pieces of our busy schedules to fit Him and to fit the specifics of worship toward Him.

This 'COVID' thing has become a big disrupter of public worship. Two experiences come to mind, well, maybe at least three. A preacher asked a person if they were tuned into the remote services, the emphasis being on remote, and the person said they were too lazy to tune into the service. Secondly, a preacher asked if a person could join the remote service and they said they were out doing something else and just forgot about the service. Then, in another instance, the preacher was told by a non-member, but professing believer, to send them an invitation to join the service, and they kept making excuses; the last of which was that they would join the remote service when they weren't as busy.

If we are to worship the King, it must be deliberate, intentional, planned, scheduled, and consistent. I wouldn't want my blessings to be a few times a year. Our worship should be personally and frequently with a body of believers, even if it is remote. Our praise and giving, which both are part of our worship, should be regular.

My proposed slogan is, JESUS IS TO BE WORSHIPPED FIRST in everything we do. Do you agree?


